Media Resources Annual Report

General

Jeff Clark retired as director in August of 2010, and a successful search was conducted for his replacement. Erika Peterson started as director in May 2011. Being short handed means that more time was spent keeping basic services running, and less time innovating than might normally be the case. Despite this, 2010-2011 was on the whole a very busy and successful year for the department.

Collections

Billy coordinated a collections inventory project, that will not only improve our ability to provide good customer service, but sets the stage for weeding of the VHS collection.

Judy worked on weeding of older media formats. We were able to withdraw filmstrips, slides and part of the audiotape collection. We will continue to work on this process in the coming academic year.

Judy has been systematically ordering dvd copies of heavily used videotapes that are showing signs of age and overuse.

Billy inventoried, tagged and fixed catalog records for all equipment loans. The inventory spreadsheet was launched this year to coincide with a nearly 30% expansion of our equipment resources.

Media Lab

The size of the media lab was doubled by adding 5 iMacs and 1 Dell workstation. New furniture for these workstations provided better positioning for use by groups.

Imaging, software licensing, and data security support for the lab was transferred to Digital Services to create consistency across L&ET public spaces.

Streaming Media

Online Video Collection (OVC)

7659 views (combined high and low bandwidth)

MDID3 was launched with a new workflow and close to 500 titles added to the Online Video Collection in 2010-2011. Billy provided production work for streaming media and metadata, and Brian and Billy collaborated on templates, spreadsheets and workflow changes to make the transition to MDID3 a complete success.

Films on Demand

6832 views

The library subscribed to Films on Demand in early 2011, which has been an excellent resource for faculty, many of who had FOD videos streaming through the Blackboard service.

Blackboard Streaming

Our Blackboard Streaming Service continues to undergo positive changes and consideration with no drop in popularity and overwhelming positive feedback from faculty about the service. We're in the midst of regular BB Streaming Strategic Plan meetings with major changes due in Fall of 2012.

In addition to library owned resources we have come to rely more heavily of outside resources such as Netflix and Amazon Instant. We will continue to evaluate the stability and performance of these products as we move more consistently toward providing online content to library users.

Digital Signage

Patti prepared 250-300 slides for flat panel display to promote our collection, services, and other topics.
